Dave recently transferred from the LaFayette Jr/Sr High School to the Onondaga Nation School where he will teach Jr. High Science and Biology starting the fall of 2023.

Individuals who nominated Dave shared the following: "This staff member treats people the way they ought to be, like they have a brain. He is a dedicated teacher and mentor, he never gives up and is an enthusiastic person, and even though he has



a tough personality he really wants what is best for students. Overall he is a caring person that will not give up on someone even when other people think they are too far gone."

As well as: "The Legend of Learning Award should have David Amidon's name on it. He has been a science teacher at LaFayette since 1999, teaching Science 8, Earth Science, Biology, and non-Regents Chemistry during his career. He has been on 8th grade teams for years, showing how valuable a team concept is at the junior high school level. During that time, the team took field trips to the Herkimer Diamond Mines, Washington D.C., and Philadelphia. Also, the 8th graders enjoyed a cross-curricular full day of activities for "War and Remembrance Day." The 2023-2024 school year is in full swing! It is great to have students and staff members back in our school buildings. On September 5th, staff members participated in a Superintendent's Conference Day and our guest speaker, Brian Mendler, provided strategies for staff members to use when building connections and relationships with students. I have been impressed listening to staff members' conversations around putting these strategies to work as they get to know their students. I foresee many lasting relationships that will help foster a positive learning environment for all students.

Staff members have also been working with students to come up with creative co-curricular club opportunities for students to extend learning beyond the school day. Those are just a few of the great opportunities that will be available throughout this school year for our students after school. Thank you to our staff members and students for coming up with great ideas to extend learning and provide opportunities to forge strong connections beyond the traditional school day.

During the school day, we remain focused on improving student learning outcomes and maximizing student learning. Students have been taking diagnostic assessments so we can identify any who may need additional academic support during the school day and beyond. Our school dismissal is altered on Monday to allow time for staff to collaborate in professional learning communities so we can focus on the following questions: 1) What do we want students to know and be able to do? 2) How do we know that students have learned these skills? 3) What are we doing to support students that have not yet demonstrated proficiency with learning 4) How do we extend or enrich the learning for students that have mastered intended learning outcomes? We are grateful to our students and families for providing this time for our staff to focus on ways to improve and enhance student learning.

These included, but were not limited to movies, professional theater, sledding at 4-Seasons, bowling, Fun Nites at school, Halloween Dances/ Haunted House, the Adirondack Museum and class trips to various amusement parks. He completed his CAS degree in 2009 and served as an intern. He has been on innumerable school and district committees. His involvement in numerous co-curricular activities include Varsity Golf, Modified Boys Basketball, the Science Olympiad, ECOS, and National Junior Honor Society. He was a teacher for the 21st Century Grant Program, "Project Challenge," which really allowed him to showcase his talents in unique ways. One of the goals of the Onondaga Nation School is to immerse our students in

Onondaga language and culture. We will use the lunar moon cycle as a guide from which teachers will create lessons in all classrooms providing students the opportunity to make cultural and linguistic connections to all subject areas. The current lunar moon is: Kheñ'deñ'gó•nah (Deer has a long tail.)

For some teachers the integration of Onondaga language

and culture into the larger curriculum is brand new. For others, this is a rekindling of a great practice that was begun three years ago.

The perpetuation of old practices continues at our school. Peter Jones, a world renowned Onondaga potter, visited on Wednesday, September 13, and held a class with our eighth graders on the making of traditional Haudenosaunee pottery. Clay and the pottery made from it were vital to the lives and traditional ways of the Haudenosaunee people. Mr. Jones will return to fire the pots with the eighth graders on October 4. Family and community members are welcome to join the students as they gather at the fire pit near the garden on the ONS campus. Nurse's Office News

Welcome to all of our new and returning students,

Please notify us if your child is ill and will miss school, especially if your child has a confirmed case of the flu, strep, COVID-19, or conjunctivitis. It is very important to keep children home 24 hours after they vomit or start taking antibiotics. They should also be fever free for 24 hours, without the aid of medication, following any illness before returning to school.

Health examinations are required for new entrants and in grades Pre K or K, 1,3,5,7,9, and 11. Health examinations are also required every year for students participating in sports, as well as those needing working papers. Please provide documentation from your healthcare provider each time a physical exam is conducted.

If your student will require any medications this year, please request the appropriate documentation from your healthcare provider. With documentation, a student may carry rescue medication, such as inhalers, epipens, and medication for management of diabetes. All other medication must be stored in the nurse's office, even if it is an over the counter medication.

Please provide documentation from the medical provider for any injury your child sustains so that we may provide the necessary care during the school day. Certain injuries may require modifications to the student's classroom assignments, as well as refraining from physical activity.

Each year, district nurses must submit the immunization status of students in Pre-k through 12th grade. Please be sure to check with your pediatrician if there are necessary immunizations for your child this year.

This year, our district also has Weight Status Category data collected by the state. No personal student identifiers are used. Fifty percent of all public schools are surveyed each year, and obesity prevalence data of school-age children and adolescents at the local and state level is used to understand the severity and distribution of obesity.


