FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

When I was a speech-language pathologist, every May I publicized Better Speech and Hearing Month in my district. It was a time to focus people's attention on the importance of having the functional ability and the necessary skills to communicate effectively. As a school administrator for nearly thirty years, I still think about those days and what that message was about. Not unlike other messages that stay with us, the meaning of that one has evolved for me over the vears.

With May upon us, I again think about Better Speech and Hearing--better communication in general. Last summer, I held listening sessions for anyone who wanted to be heard. The purpose was to facilitate an open communication system for people with an interest in the district.

Since then, we have worked to increase the flow of information among the community, staff, Board of Education and administration. Specifically, concerns about bullying have been, and continue to be, addressed. Feedback suggests that we have made great strides in our communication. This has been accomplished through the use of School Messenger calls, personal calls, email, a

revamped website, one-to-one and group meetings, and now our new district app.

With my first year as superintendent already nearing its finish line, I want to convey my appreciation to the instructional and non-instructional staff for working very successfully with a new superintendent, changes in principals, then an interim, a new director and a new network administrator. Everyone is doing an exemplary job of trying to listen carefully and collaborate with each other.

Much of the success of a school district is attributable to its Board of Education. In almost forty years in public education, I have never worked for a Board that is as cohesive and focused as this one. There are differences of opinion, but the Trustees masterfully work to identify their areas of agreement and common ground, then figure out how to arrive at compromises where they disagree. They are the best listening/ communicating Board I have known and, in my opinion, they exemplify how a Board should operate. Many thanks to them.

Big Picture Internship Spotlight



4th Grade Science Test **Explained**

The Grade 4 Elementary-Level Science Test is a cumulative assessment that covers science concepts learned in grades Kindergarten through Fourth Grade, whereas the New York State Grade 8 Intermediate-Level Science Test focuses on content and skills learned from Fifth through Eighth grade. Both tests consist of two components: a Written Test and a Performance Test. The Written Test consists of multiple-choice and open-ended questions. The Performance Test consists of hands-on tasks set up at three stations.

Health Office News

I hope everyone enjoyed Spring Break with your children! Hopefully, you all got some fresh air and exercise, and are coming back to school healthy!

There were still some cases of strep throat last month, but mainly viral illnesses including colds and upset stomachs, as well as some flu, but overall, we had a healthier month at school. Please remember to keep any child with a fever home for 24 hours after their temperature returns to normal without the aid of medicine, and for a full day after vomiting.

We sometimes see a spike in cases of lice in the spring as children are sharing ballcaps, batting helmets, etc. This would be a good time to remind your child not to share anything with other children that goes on their head/hair such as hats, hairties, or combs and brushes. I would suggest your child use his/her own pillow and blanket if they sleep over at a friend's house. It is a good idea for girls with long hair to keep it pulled back or up at school. Please try to check your child's hair at home a couple of times per week, especially if they are scratching their heads more than normal, as the main sign of lice is an itchy scalp.

All children entering PK/K/2nd and 4th Grades in the fall will need to have a physical exam. Please send in a copy of the exam as soon as your child's is completed. The state is also requesting that a dental exam be done and a form be filled out by your dentist and sent into school the same years that physicals are done. The dental forms will be attached to the physical forms that will be sent home with your child at the end of the month for your convenience.

I'm planning on offering physicals at Grimshaw this year for 6th grade students entering 7th grade. However, as of press time, I didn't have a definite date yet. I'm aiming for the first week in June. The paperwork regarding these physicals with the date will be sent home with your child on or about May 22nd. A parent must sign and send back the form to school by the deadline in the letter if you want the exam done here.

Please send in any medicine your child may need for asthma/allergies/beestings as this is the season for asthma, pollen and bees. Many children are suffering from allergies this time of year, and sometimes it's hard to tell the difference between allergies and a cold. I can offer a few guidelines that may be helpful: Colds usually start with body aches, low-grade fever and scratchy throat followed by a cough and runny nose with yellow mucous. Allergies, on the other hand, do not present with a fever and body aches but with itchy, watery eyes, cough and runny nose with clear mucous. A cold usually runs its course in 3-14 days, where an allergy can last weeks or even months.

Kindergarten Screening was held this month and I enjoyed meeting all your little ones that will be joining us next year. Please remember to bring or send in a copy of your child's immunization record if you didn't bring it to your child's screening. We will also need a copy of any immunizations received over the summer, as well as a copy of their Kindergarten physical done after 1/1/15.

All students entering 6th Grade are required to have a Tdap vaccine before entering school in September, if they've turned 11 years old. You should have received a letter before the April Break with detailed information about this. All 6th Grade students will be required to have had 2 doses of Varicella(chickenpox) to enter 6th grade, also. Please discuss this with your child's doctor so you can have this taken care of before school starts in the fall.

As most of you know from last year, several changes were made by the NYS-DOH regarding immunization requirements at each elementary grade level. They are currently working on updating those regulations again, but they have not been finalized at this time. It does however look like Kindergarten students will need 2 Varicella vaccinations, 2 MMR's, 5 Dtaps, 4 polios plus 3 Hep.B's to enter Kindergarten. In Pre-K and Grades 1-5, the vaccines required are the same as last year, but some children may need another dose. Please review your child's immunization record with your doctor. I'll keep you posted on the changes as soon as more information is available and becomes finalized. I'll post a chart on the website as well as in this newsletter to help you understand these changes as soon as I have the latest information. I'm sure many of you will have questions as we go through these changes together. Feel free to call me!


