Most of my time was spent teaching ELA workshops, or helping students with direct writing instruction. During exploratory workshop, I have been working with Sean and Evan on Vex robotics. This week we assembled the chassis and experimented with gear ratios for the drive system. Next week we are hoping to complete the drive system, and have a completely controllable robot frame.

In entrepreneurship workshop, we began planning out some products for Valentine's Day. This week we experimented with making chocolate truffles. Our first prototype came out tasting very good, however needs some aesthetic upgrades. We will be continuing to improve these next week. 



With a full five-day week, we were able to build academic momentum and have a consistent focus on some of our upcoming exams and requirements in advisory. In workshops, we were also able to make good progress on a biology lab, monitor a class project and review for the upcoming LE Regents exam.

In advisory, we clarified our Health and Participation In Government (PIG) requirements and took concrete steps. We chose project topics for Health and Walt helped 301s begin to plan their PIG public policy papers. I also reintroduced 301s to the online resources offered on the library homepage. And Walt worked with 301s to prepare for the upcoming ELA exam. Meanwhile, I was able to have some very productive project planning meetings.

In ER, we continued to monitor and adjust pH levels for our hydroponics setup. We are now at the point where students can test and record pH and ppm without my oversight. They are not only good at it, but they enjoy the process as well. We are observing significant growth in our plants and are looking to increase the number of setups.

In LE we began the Beaks of Finches lab with the 101s. They used pliers and tweezers to simulate finch beaks and we conducted a number of feeding trials using various seeds. The group did a nice job and showed genuine interest in learning about other unique organisms from the Galapagos Islands.

I did not get out to many site visits this week but next week will provide me the opportunity to regroup with students regarding internship goals.
