Bri's focus was dog training and she built a number of obstacles for a dog agility course. She showed a video of herself guiding her dog through the various course elements. This project is particularly relevant because it is setting the groundwork for her proposed STP, the creation of a dog park.

Tresah is also working with dogs and has maintained an internship at Blue Collar Doggie Daycare. Tresah's project is to create a photo wall with dozens of pictures that she is taking of the dogs. She is also using some photos on social media to assist in marketing. Although this project is not yet complete, it exemplifies a great project as it capitalizes on a student's existing talents, pushes them out of their comfort zone and benefits the worksite.

RJ taught the panel a great deal about roofing with his interactive presentation. RJ took what he learned from his mentor and crew members at STUDCO Construction and really narrowed the focus on aspects of roofing.

He even took the panel into the shop where he demonstrated the layout and installation process for 3-tab asphalt roofing shingles. It was a very informative presentation.

Jamus took us through the elements of wilderness survival and his personal trial and error with those elements. Jamus showed us the shelter prototypes (complete with operational door), how to start a fire

without matches or a lighter, and how <u>not</u> to store food in the woods. It was an engaging presentation with an edited video as documentation of the final excursion.

There were many other great projects as well.

Kyle showed us everything a car owner should know about brake safety, Thomas taught us how the commerce of online gaming card sales operates. Kaia showed us how to search for the right college. Kaleb tracked and correlated a good diet and rest with his daily moods and energy levels. Alyssa continued with her

project and shared a number of recordings that she made. And Audrey took us on a very informative virtual tour of the Onondaga Nation through photographs that she made.


Overall it was a solid exhibition cycle and hopefully we can keep up the positive momentum through the end of the year. Happy Spring and have a great week.


