
TGIF from Walt


that fit their interests and personalities.

The LaFayette School Branch of SECNY opened this week with Jamus, Kaia, and Randy



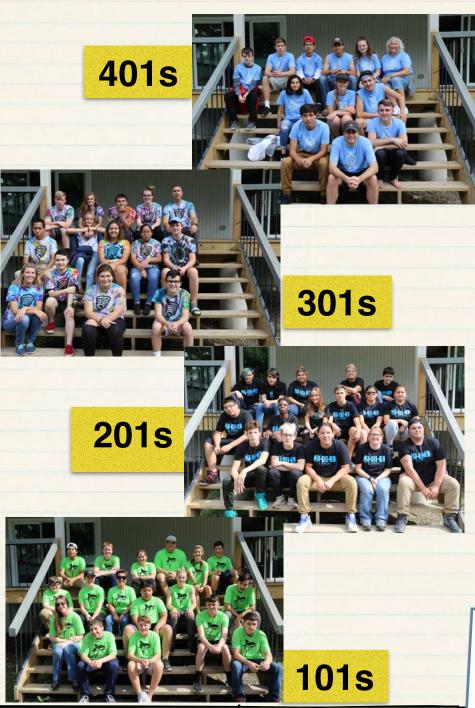
