From the DESK of the BOARD OF EDUCATION

Hi Folks;

This month, I have been tasked with providing background information on the Capital Improvement Project and the vote by the tax payers to approve the creation of a bond to pay for the project.

The overall project mission is four fold:

- 1. To maintain current infrastructure @ Jr./Sr. HS, Grimshaw and District Office (per state requirements).
 - a. Roof Replacements
 - b. Energy Performance upgrades to HVAC Systems
 - c. Replacement of mechanical equipment
- 2. To address and improve operational safety and security issues at Grimshaw and the Jr./Sr. High School.
 - a. Improve security at building entrances
 - b. Enhance building monitoring
 - c. Create a dedicated parent drop off loop at Grimshaw
 - 3. To improve and maximize building space.
 - a. Physically align "Project Lead The Way" with Math and Science.
 - b. Redesign space in the LGI and Auditorium to enhance the Vocal and Instrumental Music curriculum, as well as the space for concerts and musicals.
 - c. Renovate existing space at the Jr./Sr. HS Campus to create a dedicated "Big Picture School".
 - 4. Maintain fiscal responsibility.

The critical dates on the "Time Line" for the project are as follows:

- 1st Informational Presentation Wednesday September 25th @ 6:00 PM in the LGI
- 2nd Informational Presentation Tuesday October 15th @ 6:00 p.m. in the LGI
- Budget vote October 25th , 2013
- Projected Beginning of Construction December 2014
- Projected End of construction August 2015

The cost of the entire project will be \$12,477,222. The portion of the cost that the tax payers in LaFayette will be responsible for will be between \$70,000 and \$94,000. The tax payers costs will be spread out over the first four years of the bond repayment period. The greatest liability will be in the first year of the repayment period and will be in the neighborhood of \$70,000. The remainder of the cost will come to the district via NYS Education Department funding.

The project is considered by the Board of Education and the Administration of the LaFayette Central School District to be necessary to continue to provide our children with a positive educational experience that allows them to successfully and enthusiastically pursue their interests and ensures that they are fully prepared to take the next step in their lives post public high school.

Please be sure to put these dates in your calendars so that you will have the time to come to the informational meetings to prepare yourself to cast a well informed vote.

Thank you all for the continual support for our schools in LaFayette.

CURRICULUM CONVERSATIONS

Opening day of the 2013/14 school year for staff began with presentations by two guest speakers, each with a unique message, yet both recognizing the impact educators can and will have on our children.

Jake Edwards of the Onondaga Nation began by translating a message of Thanksgiving to Mother Earth and the Creator. He followed with an abbreviated history of the Haudenosaunee and the relationship with settlers. Using the Hiawatha belt to illustrate, Jake explained how the five Nations of the Mohawk, Oneida, Onondaga, Cayuga and Seneca, once enemies, came together in peace (later the Tuscarora joined, forming the Six Nations). He explained how the model of democracy, as seen in the US Constitution, came from the Haudenosaunee. As a student, Jake said History class was often in conflict with the history he had learned from his elders and stressed the importance of learning from other cultures and appreciating cultural differences. Jake explained the Two Row Wampum treaty, a treaty between the Dutch and the Haudesosaunee. The Wampum belt showed how the Dutch and the Haudenosaunee could travel side by side. as in canoes on the same river. 2013 marks the 400th anniversary of this important treaty with the Two Row Wampum Renewal Campaign.* Jake introduced Andy Mager of NOON (Neighbors of the Onondaga Nation), who showed a video of the 13-day canoe trip down the Hudson River to NYC, concluding at the United Nations. Natives and non-Natives paddled side by side in the spirit of the Two Row. Jake ended with an invitation to attend a ceremony marking the anniversary of the 1794 Treaty of Canandaigua which occurs in Seneca Falls annually on November 11th.

Our second speaker was Yvonne Conte, a motivational humorist and author who indeed got us laughing—and thinking. She used some personal anecdotes when talking about how our perceptions are often based on limited information, misinformation, or even prejudices. She urged us to consider how changing how we look at things can lead to increased happiness. Moving slightly away from her intended speech, Ms. Conte told the story of her daughter and how one high school teacher literally changed the course of her life. Ms. Conte emphasized how even small things that a teacher does can have life-long implications.

While Jake Edwards and Yvonne Conte each came with a specific purpose and intent, there was a subtle yet unifying theme. Both were educators who spoke of the importance of teachers and what they teach, intended and unintended. Both spoke of respect for ourselves, for each other, both spoke of peace—in ourselves, in our world. **To learn more about the Two Row, go to www.honorthetworow.org*

Water Reporting

As required by County & State regulations, water samples were taken from District wells for analysis by Don Warnow, Safety Officer of OCM BOCES, on August 26, 2013. The samples were then sent to Microbac Laboratories.

The reports indicate that the water supplies were of a satisfactory, sanitary quality for all locations. However, C. Grant Grimshaw water supplies tested slightly higher than 20 mg/l of sodium. Although there is not a set maximum level for sodium, it is recommended by the County that people on severely restricted sodium diets should be made aware.

Therefore, for those that may be on a severely restricted sodium diet, it is recommended that caution be used when consuming the water from the Grimshaw and the Onondaga Nation Schools.

PLAN

All sophomores can take the PLAN test on Wednesday. November 27. Cost is \$13. This exam can assist students in preparing for the ACT and other national college entrance testing programs. PLAN also helps to identify career interests and relates these to educational and training requirements.

Over the past year, we have implemented several targeted changes in the areas of ELA and Math so that we may increase the rigor of our instructional programs. Most recently, the 5th and 6th grade teams have developed a plan to redesign their Fridays to incorporate more time for students to explore mathematical concepts. Below are some of the highlighted changes that we have initiated. We will continue to monitor our students' academic progress as we always look to make improvements in our instructional programs.

- Expanded phonemic awareness / phonics interventions for Grades K-1
- Expanded our Math intervention services in Grades K-3
- Increased Rigor of Kindergarten Benchmarks
- Increased instructional time in Grades K-6
- Redesigned our Math and ELA intervention • services in Grades 4-6
- Instituted an ELA enrichment program for Grades 4-6
- Adopted Common Core aligned PK-6 Math Programs

Each year, we assess our building security infrastructure and review our procedures/protocols. Dear Parents,

I hope you've enjoyed the beautiful Fall we've had so far! I know it's a busy time of year for everyone getting back in the school routine. Hopefully, your child's school year is going well!

We've been pretty healthy here so far this year. There have been some illnesses-- mainly colds and allergies. If your child is diagnosed with a specific contagious disease such as strep throat, please let me know so I can notify other parents if necessary. We have not yet had any cases of "Infuenza-like illness" which is defined as a fever >100 accompanied by a cough and sore throat. I encourage you all to get those flu shots! It is also very important to keep any child with a fever home until they have been fever free for 24 hours without the aid of medication and feel well enough to return to school.

Many children are suffering with allergies/asthma this time of year. If your child needs an inhaler, please be sure we have one available in school. If your child has a severe allergy requiring an Epipen for emergency use, please be sure to bring it in with a new order if you haven't already done so. Remember, all meds must be renewed each year. They don't hold over from year to year. All meds require a physician's order. This includes over-the-counter as well as prescription meds.

All students in Pre-K, Kindergarten, 2nd and 4th grades, as well as those new to the district, should have a physical on file or have notified me of the date it's scheduled to be done. Be sure to send in a copy when it's completed. Thanks to all of you who have already sent in this information.

A big "thank-you" also to all the parents of Pre-K, Kindergarteners and 6th graders who got their immunizations in on time! Your cooperation is certainly appreciated!

As most of you know, 6th grade students who are 11 yrs. old need to have a Tdap vaccine to enter 6th grade. This is an ongoing requirement so 5th grade parents need to keep this in mind for next year, too. If your child turns 11 after school starts, they must get their Tdap as soon as possible after their birthday.

Please be sure your child has sneakers to wear on the playground as this prevents many accidents caused by flip-flops/sandals. If your child is in the primary grades please send in extra play clothes with them in case they need to change for any reason.

Please keep updating emergency information throughout the year as it is important we be able to reach you quickly in an emergency. Again, thank-you for all your cooperation on the above!

INITIAL NOTIFICATION TO PERSONS IN PARENTAL RELATION AND STAFF PURSUANT TO SECTION 409-H OF THE STATE EDUCATION LAW.*

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The LaFayette Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.
