


Robotics Team Success

The LaFayette Jr/Sr High School Robotics team had a short season this year with only two competitions; however, the students brought home the 2nd best finish ever in LaFayette Robotics history!

The team participated in the VEX V5 "High Stakes" Robotics Competition. This year's game challenged students to design, build, and program a robot that could pick up rings and place them onto mobile stakes. The team was led by senior and captain Paul Wells. Thomas Somerlot created a reliable and stable drivetrain, while Hudson Borchert and Sye Stanton worked on the mechanisms to pick up and unload the rings. Darren Benjamin took it



upon himself to learn how pneumatic systems work and used that knowledge to build a device to pick up and hold the mobile stakes. Cameron White was the lead programmer and wrote code that allowed the robot to complete tasks autonomously. Cosmo Fanizzi proved indispensable as a driver for the robot and as team representative, while Landon Kendall came in clutch on tournament days with clever and quick repairs in the pit.
