Dear LaFayette Families and Staff Members:

The 2021-2022 school year is racing to a close. This year has been a memorable one for sure. We are grateful to all community members that turned out for our annual school district budget vote and board of education election. Our alumni continue to return with

praise for the opportunities that LaFayette offered preparing them for future careers or college. Several of our alumni have been able to graduate from college early thanks to the college credits they earned during their time as a Lancer. Next year, all of our graduating seniors will have at least one college credit class on their transcript thanks to our ever expanding partnerships with local colleges and universities. We are incredibly proud of the class of 2022. Our graduates will be missed, but we know that they will continue to stay connected. Once a Lancer....Always a Lancer!

As we see the horrific tragedies that occurred in the recent shooting in a supermarket in Buffalo and an elementary school in Texas, we are making sure that we remain ever vigilant in prioritizing school safety. I have talked to a few parents who have expressed various concerns. As a father of two teenagers, a spouse of a teacher, and a school employee who is responsible for the safety of 800 students and 250 staff members, safety is always my number one goal. At LaFayette, we take a comprehensive approach to school safety. We are fortunate to have dedicated security personnel in each of our school buildings. We are currently conducting our annual review of our school safety plans and looking to refine our approaches to training ensuring that every staff member plays an active role in keeping our campus safe. We have always emphasized, "If you see something, say something." I would like to challenge our staff members not to just say something, but to do something. If you see a door propped open during school hours, close it. If you don't recognize someone in the hallway, stop and introduce yourself and ask them if they have checked in at the main office. We will continue to work with our students and staff to make sure that safety is at the forefront of everything we do. We know that students need to feel physically and emotionally safe in order for any real learning to occur.

As we head into next school year, we are grateful for the addition of a school social worker at Grimshaw elementary. Starting next school year, we will have a total of three social workers along with our team of counselors and school psychologists to help address the social, emotional, and mental health needs of our students. We know that the past two years have been tough for everyone, especially for our students. We know that the stress placed on families during this pandemic has a ripple effect that extends to our youngsters and we want to make sure that we provide our students with the skills they need to be successful both in school and life. If your family or your child is struggling, don't hesitate to reach out and ask for help. We want to partner with students and families to promote the success of the whole child.

Thank you for your continued support and partnership. We have an incredible school community because we put our students first!

News from the Nurse's Office

Hope everyone is ready for an amazing summer! Some things to keep in mind before the start of next school year:

Physical exams are due for all new students, as well as those students entering grades pre-K or K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 11th per state law, and must be dated no more than 12 months prior to the start of the school year in which they are required or the date of entrance of new students. In addition to this, any student applying for working papers or intending to play sports must have a valid physical dated no more than one year prior.

While at your doctor's office for a physical examination, use that opportunity to speak with your healthcare provider about any immunizations your child may need for the coming school year. Your building school nurse may get in touch with you via phone or letter at some point this summer, or early next school year, if there are any immunizations that your child is missing.


Your school nurse is also not permitted to administer any medication without an order from your child's doctor, as well as signed parental permission. Please get updated orders for any medications your child will require for the school year.

8th Graders Explore Impacts on Local Watershed



On May 24th, the 8th grade visited 3 locations on Onondaga Creek to examine how a stream's characteristics can change as it runs through our region. Mr. Amidon is working with the Onondaga Environmental Institute (OEI) on a series of lessons to help students understand the ecosystems around us, which culminated in this event. OEI staff led our students through a series of activities, including macroinvertebrate cataloging, testing water quality, habitat analysis, and modeling how everyday events can impact the environment in a watershed. Students were able to get their feet wet at the Onondaga Creek fishing access on Tully Farms Road, explore the impact of mudboils at Otisco Road, picnic at Kelley Brothers Park and discuss how municipalities will manage waterways to minimize property damage. A lot of science happened on a very fun field trip!


