March is an exciting time as we celebrate Music in Our Schools month. The famous author Henry Wadsworth Longfellow once said, "Music is the universal language of mankind". We look forward to sharing the love of music during this month with our students and school community. I hope everyone enjoyed the Jr/Sr High School musical, "Freaky Friday". It was great to have a

packed house to cheer on our student performers. Our music teachers, Ms. Snyder at Grimshaw and Ms. Cook at ONS, are playing name that tune with our students during the morning announcements.

On Wednesday March 2nd, the statewide mask mandate was lifted, and face masks are now optional for students and staff. We are in the process of updating our reopening plan based on recently released guidance. Currently, the only individuals that are required to wear a face mask are those who attend school during the "soft quarantine" period which occurs on days 6-10 after symptom onset or days 6-10 after the date of a positive test. I spoke with both masked and unmasked students and staff members on March 2nd. Many were pleased that masks are no longer required, others made the choice to continue to wear a mask. Reasons for continuing to wear a mask included the added protection for immunocompromised family members, the addition of a new baby in the family, or to provide an added layer of protection for themselves. Our unmasked students and staff expressed that they wanted to see faces again and that they felt that it was safe to take off the mask. We look forward to continuing an environment that is supportive of either choice. At the Onondaga Nation School, we will work with Onondaga Nation leaders to follow the safety protocols requested by Council. COVID has had a significant impact on our lives during the past two years and we welcome any step towards returning to normalcy in our schools.

During the month of March, we will continue to finalize our school district budget for 2022-2023. Our proposed spending plan will continue to support all our current programs and opportunities for students. We are also expanding school social worker services at Grimshaw Elementary as we plan to add a school social worker for the upcoming school year. Be sure to check out our school budget webpage on our website to stay up to date on our proposed spending plan.

Board of Education Elections

On May 17th, LaFayette Central School District voters will choose two district residents to serve on the Board of Education.

Candidates may be nominated only by petition and must collect at least 25 signatures from qualified school district voters to be placed on the ballot. Petitions, which are available now, must be filed by 4:00 p.m. April 18th with the District Clerk, LaFayette Central School District Office, 5955 US Route 20, LaFayette, NY 13084. Contact District Clerk Paula Hibbert at 315-677-9728 or by email phibbert@lafayetteschools.org for a nominating petition.

Comprised of seven school district residents elected by voters, the LaFayette Board of Education is the official policy-making body of the school district and is responsible for carrying out the laws and regulations pertaining to the education of children living within the district. The board adopts district policy, curriculum, programs of study, and approves the hiring of all personnel, as well as establishing the conditions of employment. The board is also responsible for maintaining district facilities, establishing an annual budget and setting a tax levy.

Two terms of office will expire on June 30, 2022. In May, two candidates will be elected for three-year terms (July 1, 2022 - June 30, 2025). Board members are not financially compensated.

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Mrs. Oliver Receives 2022 Unsung Hero Award



Mrs. Oliver, founder and director of the LaFayette After School Program (LASP), received one of Syracuse University's 2022 Unsung Hero Awards, which is given in honor of Martin Luther King's positive vision and hope for the world. LASP began as a small program in community centers and churches. Mrs. Oliver has provided childcare to the Onondaga County community

for over 35 years and currently operates a full wrap-around program that offers preschool, afterschool and summer programs at C. Grant Grimshaw Elementary. Early childcare is a uniquely vulnerable and valuable time in learning and development. The wrap-around program gives the children and families in LaFayette and the Onondaga Nation access to high quality childcare that lays the foundation for healthy development.

A passion for childcare came from her mother, who also worked with children. Prior to childcare Mrs. Oliver worked with computers and ran a small farm with her husband. She could not have guessed that childcare would be her destiny. She saw the need, spoke to neighbors, received the community's support and was housed in a church. There she started her journey providing childcare.

Over the past two years, during the pandemic, Mrs. Oliver dedicatedly continued to provide invaluable services to families and worked where needed to make sure all

programs were continuously available. She gives credit to the school for being supportive of her decision and helping her remain open. The school gave her the space, rules and resources she needs to be successful. During the pandemic she also organized a professional development opportunity for the District where participants enhance their skills in recognizing stress in young children and learn supportive strategies to address the increased mental health magnified by COVID 19.

Mrs. Oliver has also worked with the children under her care to make sure their voices are heard. In the spirit of listening to and learning from others, she organized a group of children to attend the After-School Advocacy Day in Albany, New York, charting a course of action. Oliver lifted the voices of the children, creating an opportunity for them to develop self-advocacy skills and express their needs in the state capital. As a result, the LaFayette Central School District received a grant to support five years of after school programming. Mrs. Oliver is involved in numerous community organizations. She has worked with Citizens United Revitalizing Neighborhoods and Light a Candle for Literacy in Syracuse. Children from both Syracuse and LaFayette came together to understand how we live together while valuing diverse living environments.

Mrs. Oliver plans on retiring after this year. Congratulations Mrs. Oliver on your retirement and receiving the 2022 Unsung Hero Award in the honor of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The district recognized Mrs. Oliver at the February's Board of Education meeting and received a wave of responses on LaFayette Facebook.

New York State Education Law Section 3635(2) requires that a written request be made to the Board of Education of a School District when transportation of a student to a non-public, private or parochial school is required. This written request must be made annually and be received by the school district no later than April 1st for transportation for the next school year. Most non-public schools have a form available to make this request and can be contacted for assistance.
