Welcome to November! October flew by with several great community and school events: Apple Fest, the Grimshaw Walk-A-Thon, Big Picture Senior Thesis Project Presentations, Homecoming, and the Grimshaw Elementary Halloween Parade. Thank you to our students, staff, families, and community members for participating in these great events.

During the month of October, CNY celebrated the news that a large microchip factory operated by Micron will be building a manufacturing facility north of the city

of Syracuse. One of the driving forces behind Micron's decision to call CNY home was the strength of area schools, colleges, and universities. Local news sources referenced that Onondaga Community College will provide a training pipeline for Micron jobs. LaFayette is proud to offer over 16 college credit courses, many of which are offered through OCC. Students also have the chance to spend time on the OCC College campus and we are part of the OCC Advantage Program. This provides a college preparation and scholarship program that allows LaFayette students to attend OCC tuition free.

The preparation for welcoming large employers such as Micron, Amazon and infrastructure projects will require heavy involvement from the building trades and other career fields. LaFayette is proud to coordinate internships in several areas that will have a direct connection to the trades and careers through Big Picture School and OCM BOCES Career and Technical Education. We currently have upwards of 36 students leaving our Big Picture School every Tuesday and Thursday for internship opportunities. We also have twenty students enrolled in CTE programs at OCM BOCES with students participating in programs such as heavy equipment, welding, culinary, and cosmetology. For comparison purposes, during my first year in the district we had as few as five students enrolled in OCM BOCES CTE programs. I am proud of our schools for connecting our students directly with the workforce.

As we look forward to these great opportunities for our students and for CNY in general, there are several conversations happening with school leaders on how we can best prepare our students for these careers. This is an exciting time for our local community. We are also working with our students to build character traits, social and emotional learning skills, and mental health awareness to make sure that they are prepared to meet a variety of demands in their future careers and life in general. The past few years have been challenging to say the least, but we are well positioned for a bright and positive future. Certainly, we could not do any of this without such a strong and supportive community. Thank you for cheering on our students towards a bright and promising future! Go Lancers!
