## **♦ TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION ◆**

Buses will leave the Bus Garage between 6:30 a.m. and 6:45 a.m. each morning to pick up all students in the LaFayette School District. Adjustments to the bus routes will be made during the first couple weeks of school. Students will arrive at the Onondaga Nation School by 7:45 a.m. The students that attend the Jr./Sr. High School will arrive by 7:30 a.m. The buses will then proceed to the Grimshaw Elementary School and students who participate in the breakfast program will be released beginning at 7:40 a.m. while the remaining students will be released off the bus no earlier than 7:50 a.m.

All Onondaga Nation School students will have their own busing this school year. There are two buses designated for students who attend the Onondaga Nation School only and two buses for students residing on the Onondaga Nation who attend LaFayette HS and Grimshaw Elementary schools. The two buses that are designated for the Onondaga Nation School (ONS) will have a sign in the window of the bus to distinguish them from the buses going to LaFayette HS and Grimshaw Elementary.

All private and parochial students will be picked up by their respective buses for the school they are attending. In the afternoon, students will ride their respective bus home or meet an activity run bus at the LaFayette Jr./Sr. High School, depending on the time.

All Thompson Road Boces students will ride into the high school where they will transfer to their shuttle bus.

Be sure to carefully check to see which route and bus your child(ren) have been assigned to. If you have any questions on any of the routes, or if it is not clear what bus your child should ride, please contact the Transportation Office at (315) 677-9700. You are welcome to call this number whenever you have a concern, comment or suggestion. The following pages list the morning bus routes for the upcoming school year.



**Bus #149** A.M. Route (ONS STUDENTS ONLY) - From Bus Garage proceed North on Route 11. Bear Right onto McClary Rd. Left on Kennedy Rd. Left on Kennedy Rd Spur. Right on Route 11 to the Nation Line. From the Nation Line heading south on Route 11A and continuing to Hemlock Rd. Left turn onto Hemlock Rd. Right on Duggetts Hill Rd to end. Left on Maybee Rd to turn around. Left on Duggets Hill Rd. Left on Quarry Rd. Left on Hemlock Rd to turn around. Left onto Webster Rd to turn around. Bear Left onto Hemlock Rd Left on Route 11A. Right into ONS. Return to the Bus Garage.

**Bus #177** A.M. Route (ONS STUDENTS ONLY) - From Bus Garage turn Right onto Route 20 to Cardiff. Left onto Route 11A to Rowland Rd and Left onto Route 20. Right onto Everingham Rd. Right on Buffalo Hill Rd. to turn around. Left onto Everingham Rd. Left onto Route 20, Left onto Tully Farms Rd. Left onto Route 11A heading North. Start picking up students at Nation Line. Left on Gibson Rd. Right onto Route 80. Left onto Commissary Rd to turn around. Right onto Route 80. Left onto Gibson Rd. Left onto 11A. Right onto Martins Lane. Right to Upper Martins to turn around. Right onto Martins Lane. Left on Hemlock Rd. Left on Route 11A. Right into ONS. Return to the Bus Garage.

**Bus #151** A.M. Route - (STUDENTS RESIDING ON THE NATION WHO ATTEND LAFAYETTE HS OR GRIMSHAW ELEMENTARY) From Bus Garage, the bus will proceed right on Route 20 to Everingham Rd, continuing to turn around on Buffalo Hill Rd. Left, back on Everingham Rd. Left on Route 20 heading east. Left on Tully Farms Rd Ext. Left on Route 11A beginning pickups at the Onondaga Nation Line. Continue on Route 11A to Gibson Rd. Turn left on Gibson Rd. Right on Route 80. Left on Commissary Rd and continue up to the turnaround point. Return on Commissary Rd to Route 80 to Gibson Rd to Route 11A. Turn left onto Route 11A. Right onto Martins Lane. Left onto Hemlock Rd and then proceed to Grimshaw.

**Bus #176** A.M. Route - (STUDENTS RESIDING ON THE NATION WHO ATTEND LAFAYETTE HS OR GRIMSHAW ELEMENTARY) - From Bus Garage, Left on Route 20. Left on Route 11 heading North and picking up students who reside on the Nation toward the Nation Line. Turn around and pick up at the Nation Line before heading down 11A heading south. Continue on Route 11A all the way to Hemlock Rd. Left turn onto Hemlock Rd. Bear Right onto Webster Rd and go to turn around. Come back out and go Right onto Hemlock Rd. Right onto Duggetts Hill Rd. Right on Quarry Rd. Right on Route 11 to LaFayette HS and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #163** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/ Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, the bus will turn right on Route 20 then onto Ortloff Rd. From Ortloff Rd, the bus will turn left onto Route 11A continuing to Nichols Rd. Turn Right onto Nichols Rd. then right onto Tully Farms Rd, and then right onto Webster Rd. to turnaround point. Return to Tully Farms Rd and then left onto Bear Mountain Rd to the turnaround point. Turn left off of Bear Mountain onto Tully Farms Rd and then left onto Route 20 west to turnaround. Return to Route 20, turning left onto Tully Farms Extension to Route 11A north. Turnaround Route 11A, head to Rowland Rd. and then back to Route 20. Head east on Route 20 to Webb rd. Turn left onto Webb Rd and then left onto Amidon Rd. Continue on Summer Ridge, turn around and continue back to Webb Rd. Left on Webb Rd. Left onto Shute Rd. Turn around, then left onto Webb rd. Proceed to LaFayette High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #172** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed north on Route 11 to Kennedy Rd. picking up students on Route 11, north of McClary Rd.. Turn right from Route 11 to Kennedy Rd, then to Sentinel Heights. Turn right on Sentinel Heights to Graham Rd. Left on Graham to LaFayette Rd. Left on LaFayette Rd. to Forestry turnaround. Back on LaFayette Rd. Continue on LaFayette Rd to Coye Rd turnaround. Right on LaFayette Rd then right onto Barker Hill Rd to turn around. Continue on Barker Hill Rd back to LaFayette Rd. Turn right and proceed to High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #173** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed left on Route 20 to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Rd. to Reidy Hill Rd and turn right. Continue on Reidy Hill Rd and then right onto Eager Rd to Apulia Rd. Turn left on Apulia Rd to Bush Rd. Right on Bush Rd to turn around. Continue back on Bush Rd to Apulia Rd, turning right. Apulia rd north to turn around, then back south on Apulia Rd to Route 20. Left on Route 20, then left on Dodge Rd to Apulia Rd and turn right. Continue to Colton Rd. Turn right on Colton to O'Connell Rd. Turn right on O'Connell and then right on Route 20 west. Proceed to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #166** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed north on Route 11 beginning pickups just north of the High School. Continue on Route 11 to McClary Rd. Proceed onto McClary, then Kennedy Rd, and then to Sentinel Heights. Continue on Sentinel Heights to Mercun Dr. Turn right on Mercun Dr to the turn around point. Back to Sentinel Heights and turn right. Continue on Sentinel Heights to Route 11. Turn left onto Route 11, pick up students on the West side of Route 11 to the Dollar General Store, turn around and then pick up students on the East side of Route 11. Continue to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #167** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will go left on Route 20 to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Rd. beginning pickups on both sides of LaFayette Rd. from Rte. 20 to Coye Rd. Turnaround at Coye and Old Coye Rd. and continue on LaFayette Rd to Bull Hill Rd. Turn Right on Bull Hill Rd picking up students on Bull Hill as the bus proceeds to McClary Rd. Left on McClary to Route 11. Left on Route 11 then left on Norman Dr. Pick up students on Norman Dr., Pioneer Rd., and then Bella Vista Dr. Continue to Mondore and turn left then left on Sentinel Heights. Continue to Winacre Dr turning right, and then proceed to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #158** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed left on Route 20 to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Rd to Reidy Hill Rd. Turn right on Reidy Hill and then right on Persse Rd to turn around. Head back to Eager Rd and turn left. Continue on Eager Rd, to Coye Rd, and then to turnaround. Proceed back on Coye Rd to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Road heading south to Commane Rd. Turn right on Commane Rd and head to Route 11. Turn right onto Route 11 and pick up at AppleRidge apartments. Continue to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #159** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed left on Route 20 picking up students on the south side of Route 20 to Apulia Rd. Right on Apulia Rd (south) to turn around. Head back north on Apulia Rd to Cascade Rd. Right on Cascade to Clark Hollow. Right on Clark Hollow to Downing Rd. Turnaround. Continue on Clark Hollow to Newell Hill Rd. Right on Newell Hill to turn around and then back to Clark Hollow. Right on Clark Hollow Rd to Route 20. Left off Route 20 onto Palmer Rd. Return on Route 20 and then left on Applewood. Turnaround and back to Route 20 to Festival Gardens. Continue on Route 20 to Route 11, picking up students on the north side of Route 20. Turn right onto Route 11 and proceed to Willow Wood apartments. Return to Route 11 and continue to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #160** A.M. Route - (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, the bus will proceed south on Route 11 to Feather Dr and Sturgeon, then back to Route 11. Turn right on Route 11 to Meeker Hill Rd. Turn left on Meeker up to turnaround. Back on Meeker Hill Rd, turning right onto Sky High Rd. to turn around. Back to Meeker to Holcomb to Meadowlark Circle; back to Holcomb turning left to Deer Run. Right on Deer Run to turn around and back on Deer Run to the opposite end and return to Holcomb to Meeker Hill to Route 11. Left on Route 11, continuing onto North Rd to the AT&T Towers. Then proceed to Maple Grove Dr. to Sugar Bush Dr then back to North Rd, turning left on Scammell Rd to Route 11. Left on Route 11 to turn around. Continue back north on Route 11 to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

home when they are sick and reach out to your child's school nurse when they are not present. We have a limited supply of rapid COVID test kits available at each school and we anticipate that more will be made available throughout the school year from New York State. At this point, face coverings are optional for students and staff. School staff will not require that anyone wears a face covering unless we are directed to do so by federal, state, or local authorities.

While schools have had to focus on making sure that we protect the physical health of students and staff over the past two years, we have also been trying to keep tabs on the overall well being of our students and staff. The past two years have been challenging and we want to make sure that we are addressing the broader needs of our students. We have hired additional members to our student support team to provide counseling support. We have instituted a Behavioral Intervention Monitoring Assessment System to help identify students who are in need of greater support in the areas of social, emotional, and mental health. We have also partnered with Onondaga County to welcome a Promise Zone Specialist. This year we are hoping to welcome the start of our school based mental health clinic (pending NYS approval) and the addition of an Access Liaison who will help to connect students and families with resources for support and assistance. For our employees, we continue to offer our Employees Assistance Program and work with our professional learning committee to identify opportunities to educate our staff on how to meet the needs of all our students.

Be sure to stay connected throughout the school year. Reach out frequently and often to share positive news. I always love hearing from teachers, students, and families about great new books in our libraries, cool new Vex robots that students are building, or awesome science experiments. I am looking forward to a great school year together!

Pete, Thank you for your continued commitment to excellence!



## Notice of Availability: Asbestos Management Plans

As provided under the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, (AHERA - EPA 40 CFR 763), LaFayette Central School District hereby makes known the steps it has undertaken to comply with AHERA and the availability of asbestos management plans.

- 1. Beginning in 1989, all district owned facilities were inspected for asbestos and management plans were developed for each building according to the requirements of AHERA. Re-inspection's are conducted every three years. Onondaga-Cortland-Madison BOCES of Syracuse, NY completed the 2019 AHERA Triennial inspection and update to the asbestos management plans.
- 2. Periodic Surveillance of asbestos containing building materials is conducted every six months.
- 3. All custodial and maintenance staff have undergone 2-hour Asbestos Awareness Training.
- 4. All response actions taken are within federal and state guidelines.

## **Notice of Annual Fire Inspection**

State Education Law requires that Fire Inspections along with Visual Inspections be conducted in District owned or leased buildings annually. These Inspections were conducted on Friday, June 24, 2022 by Ronald Cooper, Maintenance Supervisor at LaFayette Central School District and Leland Dusharm and Michael Bonvell, Safety Officers at OCM BOCES. There were a few minor violations that were mostly corrected at the time of the inspection. The rest were corrected shortly after. All appropriate reporting has been sent to the New York State Education Department as well as local Fire Departments. ### **Pesticide Notification**

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the year.

The LaFayette Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
  - · anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children:
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
  - boric acid and disodium octa borate tetrahydrate;
  - the application of EPA designated biopesticides:
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

#### Welcome to the 2022-2023 School Year

The faculty and staff at LaFayette Jr./Sr. High School have been diligently working over the summer months, making adjustments to ensure high quality instruction and prioritizing family communication. We wanted to take a moment and highlight some of the things you can expect to see during the 2022-2023 school year:

#### **Six Marking Periods**

This will provide students with a more timely academic performance review. Each marking period's grades will still be figured into your child's overall cumulative average. This year's marking period dates may be found in the Jr./Sr. High School Family/Student Handbook, posted on the LaFayette Jr. Sr. High School website homepage.

#### **Orientation Day**

On Tuesday, September 6th the District will be holding a student orientation day for all students in grades Pk-9. As a result, the Jr./Sr. High School will be open from 8:00am to 12:00p.m. and families are encouraged to stop by the high school to explore the building, get acclimated to their schedule, place personal items into their locker, and converse with teachers/staff. For those that are unable to attend, we will be sure that any handouts/materials provided during orientation day are available in the main office when your child arrives at school on Wednesday, September 7th. Lastly, while this opportunity is geared towards students in grades PK-9, we welcome all grade levels.

#### **Professional Learning Communities (PCL)**

All schools will dismiss early on Mondays to allow teachers to participate in collaborative team meetings focused on improving teaching and learning throughout our school.

These collaborative team meetings are called Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). The Jr./Sr. High School will dismiss at 2:00 p.m. on Mondays throughout the school year.

#### **Letter to Parents for School Meal Programs**

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. LaFayette CSD offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.50; lunch costs \$2.85 (PK-6) & \$2.95 (7-12). Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Beginning July 1, 2019, students in New York State that are approved for reduced price meals will receive breakfast and lunch meals and snacks served through the Afterschool Snack Program at no charge.

- 1. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Complete the application to apply for free or reduced price meals. *Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals Application for all students in your household.* We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill out all required information. Return the completed application to your child's school..
- 2. WHO CAN GET FREE MEALS? All children in households receiving benefits from SNAP, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations or TANF, can get free meals regardless of your income. Categorical eligibility for free meal benefits is extended to all children in a household when the application lists an Assistance Program's case number for any household member. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Households with children who are categorically eligible through an Other Source Categorically Eligible designation, as defined by law, may be eligible for free benefits and should contact the SFA for assistance in receiving benefits.
- 3. CAN FOSTER CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Yes, foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court, are eligible for free meals. Any foster child in the household is eligible for free meals regardless of income. Foster children may also be included as a member of the foster family if the foster family chooses to also apply for benefits for other children. Including children in foster care as household members may help other children in the household qualify for benefits. If non-foster children in a foster family are not eligible for free or reduced price meal benefits, an eligible foster child will still receive free benefits.
- 4. CAN HOMELESS, RUNAWAY, AND MIGRANT CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Yes, children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant qualify for free meals. If you haven't been told your children will get free meals, please call or e-mail your student's principal to see if they qualify.
- 5. WHO CAN GET REDUCED PRICE MEALS? Your children may be approved as reduced price eligible if your household income is within the reduced-price limits on the Federal Eligibility Income Chart, shown on this letter. Beginning July 1, 2019, students in New York State that are approved for reduced price meals will receive breakfast and lunch meals and snacks served through the Afterschool Snack Program at no charge.
- SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? Please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. Call the school at 315-677-9510 if you have questions.
- 7. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT ANOTHER ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for up to the first 30 operating days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 8. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILD(REN) GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please fill out a FREE/REDUCED PRICE MEAL application.
- WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes and we may also ask you to send written proof.
- 10. IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- 11. WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials. You also may ask for a hearing by calling or writing to: Laurie Holtsbery, 315-677-5504, lholtsbery@lafayetteschools.org.
- 12. MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You or your child(ren) do not have to be U.S. citizens to qualify for free or reduced price meals.
- 13. WHO SHOULD I INCLUDE AS MEMBERS OF MY HOUSEHOLD? You must include all people living in your household, related or not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends) who share income and expenses. You must include yourself and all children living with you. If you live with other people who are economically independent (for example, people who you do not support, who do not share income with you or your children, and who pay a pro-rated share of expenses), do not include them.
- 14. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 15. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE INCLUDE OUR HOUSING ALLOWANCE AS INCOME? If you get an off-base housing allowance, it must be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income.
- 16. MY SPOUSE IS DEPLOYED TO A COMBAT ZONE. IS HER COMBAT PAY COUNTED AS INCOME? No, if the combat pay is received in addition to her basic pay because of her deployment and it wasn't received before she was deployed, combat pay is not counted as income. Contact your school for more information.
