**Dear LaFayette School Community,**

We are excited to share with you our reopening plan for the 2021-2022 school year. A copy of our reopening plan is available

on our website.

All of our schools will welcome the return of students for five days a week of in person instruction. We are especially excited to welcome back our students at the Onondaga Nation School, which has operated via remote learning since March 2020.

Throughout the pandemic LaFayette has pulled together to meet the needs of our students and school community. When schools were closed by state officials in March 2020, LaFayette quickly shifted gears to remote learning. Our food service and transportation departments worked together to deliver meals and learning materials to students. Our teachers, teaching assistants, school counselors, psychologists, administrators, supervisors, and clerical staff worked tirelessly to meet the needs of our students.

We appreciate the support, trust, and cooperation of our students and families to operate schools safely during the pandemic. I certainly recognize that we have all given up a lot this past year, but as you read our reopening plan hopefully you will see that school activities are looking something closer to normal.

There are a few important safety precautions that we will need to take such as wearing a mask when inside the school building, washing our hands, practicing respiratory etiquette, and staying home when you are sick or have symptoms. The safety precautions outlined in this reopening plan were created by reviewing recommendations provided by the Centers for Disease Control, American Academy of Pediatrics, guidance from the New York State Education Department, guidance from Onondaga County, along with guidance from state and local health officials. The school district also met with the Onondaga Nation Council of Chiefs, Clanmothers, and Faithkeepers who developed additional precautions to safely reopen the Onondaga Nation School. We are grateful for the support of our community leaders, board of education, administrators and supervisors, school staff, public health officials, and school community during this challenging time.

We are hopeful that as conditions improve, we will be able to revisit our safety precautions. I truly appreciate all that our students, families, and staff members have done and will continue to do to keep everyone safe and maximize learning during this challenging time. Thank you again for your continued trust and support! We are looking forward to a great school year!

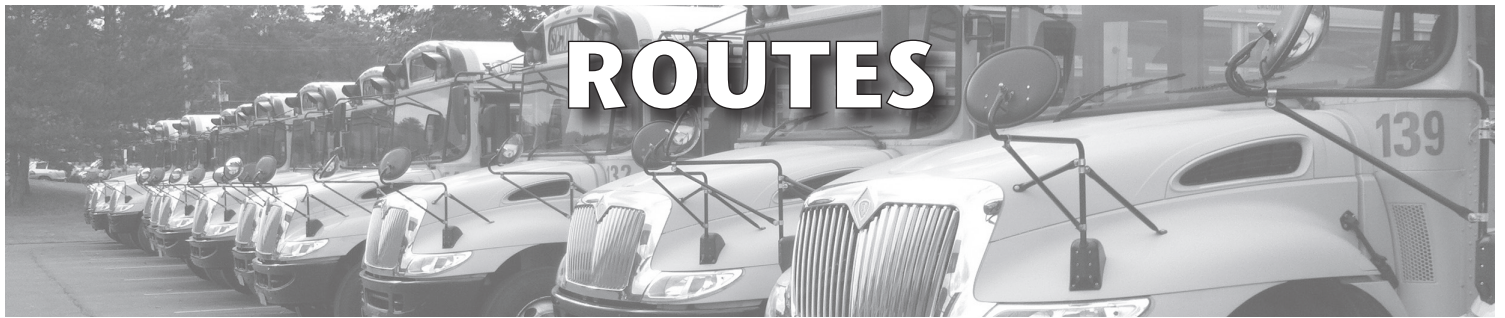

## ◆ TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION ◆

Buses will leave the Bus Garage between 6:30 a.m. and 6:45 a.m. each morning to pick up all students in the LaFayette School District. Adjustments to the bus routes will be made during the first couple weeks of school. Students will arrive at the Onondaga Nation School by 7:20 a.m. The students that attend the Jr./Sr. High School will arrive no earlier than 7:25 a.m. The buses will then proceed to the Grimshaw School and students who participate in the breakfast program will be released beginning at 7:40 a.m. while the remaining students will be released off the bus no earlier than 7:50 a.m.

All private and parochial students will be picked up by their respective buses for the school they are attending. In the afternoon, students will ride their respective bus home or meet an activity run bus at the LaFayette Jr./Sr. High School, depending on the time.

Be sure to carefully check to see which route and bus your child(ren) have been assigned to. If you have any questions on any of the routes, or if it is not clear what bus your child should ride, please contact the Transportation Office at (315)677-9700. You are welcome to call this number whenever you have a concern, comment or suggestion. The following pages list the morning bus routes for the upcoming school year.



**Bus #149 A.M. Route** (ONS & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage proceed north on Route 11 to Quarry Rd. turning right onto Old Route 11. Proceed to Frontage Rd. continuing on Duggetts Hill Rd. Left onto Maybee Lane. Return to the bridge then left on Hemlock up to the turnaround point. Return to Hemlock to Webster turning left on Webster up to turnaround point. Return to Hemlock proceeding to Martins Lane then continue to upper Martins Lane and turn around. Continue back down Martins Lane to Route 11A to the Onondaga Nation School. Return on Route 11A north to Route 11 shuttling students to High School. Return to the Bus Garage.

**Bus #148 A.M. Route** (ONS & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage proceed north on Route 11 to the line in Nedrow. Turn left and head south on Route 11A. Turn left onto Hemlock, turn around at the Longhouse, and then back to 11A. Continue south and turn right into the Onondaga Nation School. Return on Route 11A north to Route 11 shuttling students to High School. Return to the Bus Garage.

**Bus #163 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, the bus will turn right on Route 20 then onto Rowland Rd. From Rowland Rd the bus will turn right onto Route 11A continuing to Webster Rd. Turn Right onto Webster Rd. then left onto Tully Farms Rd, and then left onto Nichols Rd. returning to Route 11A heading north to turn around. Proceed on Route 11A towards Orloff Rd, then take left on Orloff Rd, back to Route 20. Head east on Route

20 to Webb rd. Turn left onto Webb Rd then left onto Amidon Rd. Continue on Summer Ridge, turn around and continue back to Webb Rd. Turn left on Webb Rd. Left onto Shute Rd. Turn around, then left onto Webb rd. Proceed to LaFayette High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #172 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed north on Route 11 to Kennedy Rd. picking up students on Route 11, north of McClary Rd. Turn right from Route 11 to Kennedy Rd, then to Sentinel Heights. Turn right on Sentinel Heights to Graham Rd. Left on Graham to LaFayette Rd. Left on LaFayette Rd. to Forestry turnaround. Back on LaFayette Rd. Turn left onto Barker Hill Rd. to turn around. Continue on Barker Hill Rd to LaFayette Rd and turn left. Continue on LaFayette Rd to Coye Rd turnaround. Right on LaFayette Rd and proceed to High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #173 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed left on Route 20 to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Rd. to Reidy Hill Rd and turn right. Continue on Reidy Hill Rd and then right onto Eager Rd to Apulia Rd. Turn left on Apulia Rd to Bush Rd. Right on Bush Rd to turn around. Continue back on Bush Rd to Apulia Rd, turning right. Apulia rd. north to turn around, then back south on Apulia Rd to Route 20. Left on Route 20, then left on Dodge Rd to Apulia Rd and turn right. Continue to Colton Rd. Turn right on Colton to O'Connell Rd. Turn right on O'Connell and then right on Route 20 west. Proceed to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

## ◆ TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION ◆

**Bus #145 A.M. Route** (ONS & Grimshaw) - From Bus Garage, the bus will proceed right on Route 20 to Everingham Rd, continuing to turn around. Return back to Route 20, turning left. Route 20 east to Tully Farms Rd Ext. Continue to Route 11A. Turn left on Route 11A beginning pickups at the Onondaga Nation Line. Continue on Route 11A to Gibson Rd. Turn left on Gibson to Route 80. Continue right onto Route 80 to Commissary Rd. Turn left on Commissary Rd and continue up to the turnaround point. Return on Commissary to Route 80 to Gibson Rd to Route 11A. Turn left onto Route 11A north and go to the Onondaga Nation School. Then proceed to Grimshaw.

**Bus #166 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed north on Route 11 beginning pickups just north of the High School. Continue on Route 11 to McClary Rd. Proceed onto McClary, then Kennedy Rd, and then to Sentinel Heights. Continue on Sentinel Heights to Mercun Dr. Turn right on Mercun Dr to turnaround. Back to Sentinel Heights and turn right. Continue on Sentinel Heights to Route 11. Turn left onto Route 11, pick up students on the West side of Route 11 to the Dollar General Store, turn around and then pick up students on the East side of Route 11. Continue to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #167 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will go left on Route 20 to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Rd. beginning pickups on both sides of LaFayette Rd. from Rte. 20 to Coye Rd. Turnaround at Coye and Old Coye Rd. and continue on LaFayette Rd to Bull Hill Rd. Turn Right on Bull Hill Rd picking up students on Bull Hill as the bus proceeds to McClary Rd. Left on McClary to Route 11. Left on Route 11, then left on Norman Dr. Pick up students on Norman Dr., Pioneer Rd., and then Bella Vista Dr. Continue to Mondore and turn right on Sentinel Heights. Continue to Winacre Dr turning right, and then proceed to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #158 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed left on Route 20 to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Rd to Reidy Hill Rd. Turn right on Reidy Hill and then right on Persse Rd to turn around. Head back to Eager Rd and turn left. Continue on Eager Rd, to Coye Rd, and then to turnaround. Proceed back on Coye Rd to LaFayette Rd. Turn left on LaFayette Road heading south to Commane Rd. Turn right on Commane Rd and head to Route 11. Turn right onto Route 11 and pick up at AppleRidge apartments. Continue to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #159 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, bus will proceed left on Route 20 picking up students on the south side of Route 20 to Apulia Rd. Right on Apulia Rd (south) to turn around. Head back north on Apulia Rd to Cascade Rd. Right on Cascade to Clark Hollow. Right on Clark Hollow to turn around. Continue on Clark Hollow to Newell Hill Rd. Right on Newell Hill to turn around and then back to Clark Hollow. Right on Clark Hollow Rd to Route 20. Left off Route 20 onto Palmer Rd. Return on Route 20 and then left on Applewood. Turnaround and back to Route 20 to Festival Gardens. Continue on Route 20, left onto Route 11 to WillowWood Apartments. Continue to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

**Bus #160 A.M. Route** (Grimshaw & LaFayette Jr/Sr HS) - From Bus Garage, the bus will proceed south on Route 11 to Feather Dr and Sturgeon, then back to Route 11. Turn right on Route 11 to Meeker Hill Rd. Turn left on Meeker up to turnaround. Back on Meeker Hill Rd, turning right onto Sky High Rd. to turn around. Back to Meeker to Holcomb to Meadowlark Circle; back to Holcomb turning left to Deer Run. Right on Deer Run to turn around and back on Deer Run to the opposite end and return to Holcomb to Meeker Hill to Route 11. Left on Route 11, continuing onto North Rd to the AT&T Towers. Then proceed to Maple Grove Dr. to Sugar Bush Dr then back to North Rd, turning left on Scammell Rd to Route 11. Left on Route 11 to turn around. Continue back north on Route 11 to the High School and then to Grimshaw.

I want to take this opportunity to welcome everyone back. We are excited to be back to a fully in-person learning environment and look forward to supporting our students by helping them to reach their maximum potential. I want to ensure our families that our number one priority is and always will be the safety of our students. With that being said, we are excited to have all our students back in-person and look forward to the progress they will make over the upcoming school year.

I would like to take a moment and remind our families about some of the recent changes we have been implementing over the past few years:

**6 Marking Period Structure** - This will provide students with a more timely academic performance review. Each marking period's grades will still be figured into your child's overall cumulative average. This year's marking period dates may be found in the Jr./Sr. High School Family/Student Handbook posted on the LaFayette Jr./Sr. High School website homepage.

**Student Drop Off Procedures** - As a result of our capital improvement project, the south parking lot will now include a newly designated student drop-off/pick-up area. Details regarding the new procedures (a detailed description and video link) can be found on the LaFayette Jr. Sr. High School website.

**District Implementation of Professional Learning Communities (PLC)** - This year, all schools will dismiss early on Mondays to allow teachers to participate in collaborative team meetings focused on improving teaching and learning throughout our school. These collaborative team meetings are called Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). The Jr./Sr. High School will dismiss at 2:00 p.m. on Mondays throughout the school year. Students who participate in athletic programs in grades 7-12 at the Jr./Sr. High School will have the availability of a sports study hall.

In addition to these previous changes, you might notice the following new changes this year:

**Focus on Grading** - The teachers at the Jr./Sr. High School have spent the summer focusing on grading. Teachers took part in a meaningful book study around the process and procedures of grading. This year, our PLC's will be focused on improving our grading practices, creating consistency in grading procedures and establishing a sense of transparency for both families and students. We are excited to take on this initiative and hope that our efforts will result in an increase in student performance.

**Increase Presence on Facebook** - After getting community feedback, it was found that most of our families use Facebook as their preferred social media platform. As a result, we have created our own LaFayette Jr./Sr. High School Facebook page. Our goal is to create one location where our families can stay current on all the happenings at the Jr./Sr. High School. Please follow us on Facebook to get real time updates and find out more about what is trending in the Jr./Sr. High School.

**Athletics Registration** - We are now using FamilyID for sports registration. Registration moving forward will be opened roughly a month before the season starts. You will register your child once, and then each sports season you will have to only update the physical form and select the sport. The link to FamilyID can be found on our Athletics Webpage.

**Athletic Schedules** - We are updating and utilizing Schedule Galaxy. This is where you can find practice, game times and departure times for our sports teams.

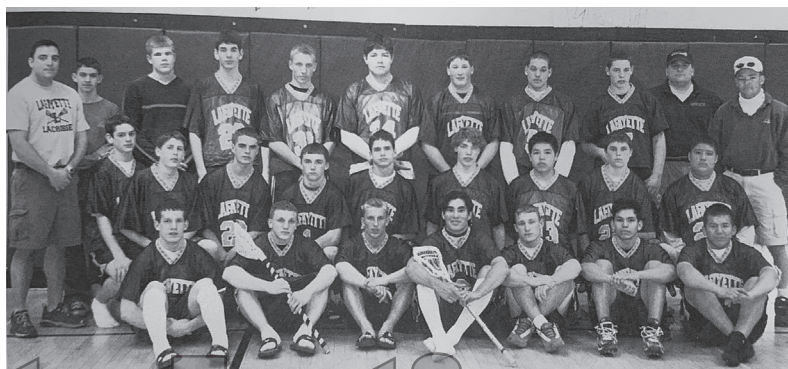
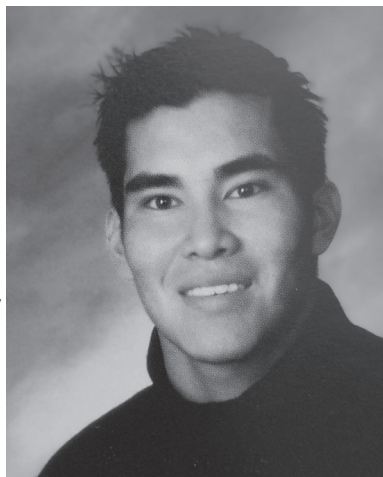
### The Upstate Lacrosse Foundation

The Upstate Lacrosse Foundation Hall of Fame – Class of 2021 will include the induction selection of two of LaFayette’s past greats – Carl “Ket” Weist and Brett Bucktooth

Carl “Ket” Weist is the founder of LaFayette Boys Lacrosse. He started the lacrosse program in 1960. Under his coaching the team won championships from 1963-1966. He then took an administrative position and turned his team over to Gordie Ohstrom. The nucleus he developed was the start of the LaFayette Lacrosse dynasty that is renowned throughout the lacrosse world.

Brett Bucktooth is a LaFayette School alum, Class of 2001. His high school career consisted of 1st Team All CNY Lacrosse for three consecutive years (99,00,01), High School All American (01), and All League Lacrosse (01). He went on to play 4 years at Syracuse University with a Championship Win in 2004. He has played for the Rochester Rattlers and Buffalo Bandits.

The Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will be held at Traditions at The Links on Sunday, October 17, 2021 @ 4pm. On Saturday, October 16th Ket and Brett will be at the LaFayette Inn for a greet and gab, please stop in as this is open to all.

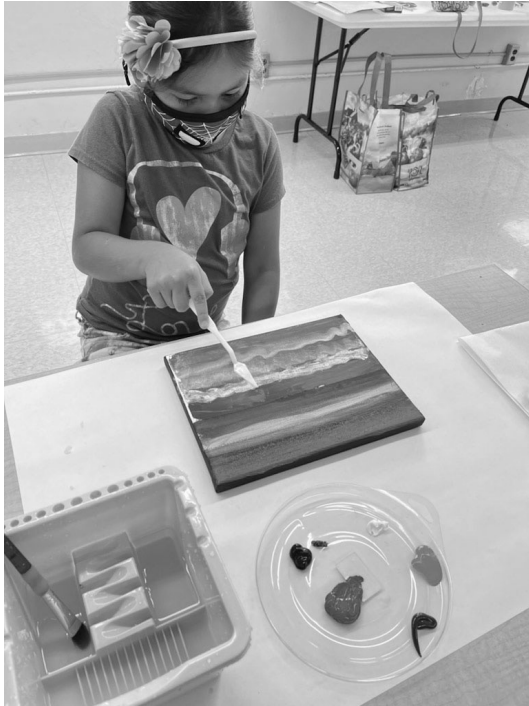

shaw welcome.

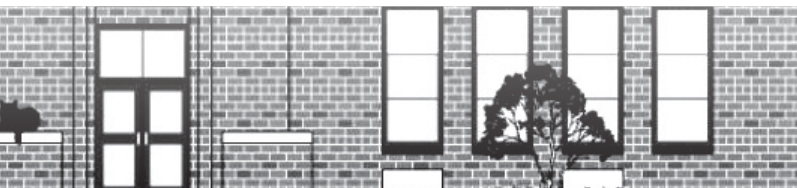
As a reminder, the entire district has set aside Monday afternoons as a time for staff members to come together in collaborative teams called Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). PLCs will work together to establish specific goals linked to improving student academic outcomes.

Students will dismiss early on Mondays at 1:45 p.m. to allow the entire district staff time to focus on the following four questions:

- 1.) What do we want students to learn? (Essential standards)
- 2.) How will we know if they have learned? (Team-developed common assessments)
- 3.) What will we do if they don't learn? (Systematic interventions)
- 4.) What will we do if they already know it? (Extended learning)



As one of our goals Grimshaw continues to work on increasing the number of students in our building that achieve PERFECT ATTENDANCE. We will be working again on identifying students that are present at school every day during each month. Being in school every day means that your child will not miss out on any learning opportunities. Please try to promote the idea that being absent from school is only for when your child is sick or if there is a family emergency. *Initial notification to persons in parental relation and staff pursuant to Section 409-h of the State Education Law.\**

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The LaFayette Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application.
- anti-microbial products.
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children.
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children.
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children.
- boric acid and disodium octa borate tetrahydrate.
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides.
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25.
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.



In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

### Notice of Annual Fire Inspection

### Asbestos Management Plans

As provided under the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, (AHERA - EPA 40 CFR 763), LaFayette Central School District hereby makes known the steps it has undertaken to comply with AHERA and the availability of asbestos management plans.

1. Beginning in 1989, all district owned facilities were inspected for asbestos and management plans were developed for each building according to the requirements of AHERA. Triennial reinspection's are conducted every three years. Onondaga-Cortland-Madison BOCES of Syracuse, NY completed the 2019 AHERA Triennial inspection and update to the asbestos management plans.

2. Periodic Surveillance of asbestos containing building materials is conducted every six months.

3. All custodial and maintenance staff have undergone two hour Asbestos Awareness Training.

4. All response actions taken are within federal and state guidelines.

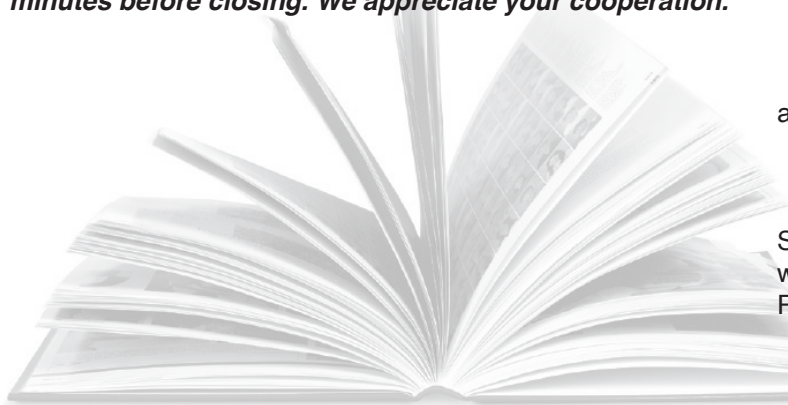
