III. District Presentation

A. <u>Construction Update - July 2023</u> - Jessica Nguyen and Chris Gray gave the construction update. The updates included the high school gym and tech suite, room 210 also room 222 at Grimshaw. Superintendent Belfield explained the reason for the increase in RFIs and the future plan to bring the RFI numbers down. Chris Gray extended on the high RFIs and the work being done. Mr. Kessler gave an update on the septic pits at Grimshaw and the Capital project at the junior senior high school. A distribution box is needed; a possible change order in the near future. Mr. Kessler's update also included the fire alarm project and the security project at the Onondaga Nation School. Nothing new on the security project. OGS completed the generator study. The location of the generator will determine the final cost. The parking lot plan is still in development. The capital construction request is in the works. The Onondaga Nation School is in really good shape to open. Superintendent Belfield gave the construction update closing comments and thanked everyone involved in getting the schools ready.

B. <u>District Comprehensive Improvement Plan (DCIP)</u>- Superintendent Belfield reviewed the LaFayette DCIP. The plan includes social and emotional learning. A survey is in the works that will go out to students, parents, and staff for ideas to continue to make school a great place for kids. Parent Square will be used for communication to parents. Information on how to use it will be sent out at the end of the week.

Trustee Gates questioned the wording of the priorities.

Mr. Belfield - Part of the plan is that every student succeeds. We are looking at different groups of students' performance. This would include students of all socioeconomic and ethnic backgrounds and students with and without disabilities. We are making sure that all students are working at high levels and that programs and instructions being used are reaching all students and aim to spark lifelong learning and a desire to learn.

President Reyburn had a question in regards to the tiers.

Superintendent Befield - (Tier I is everyone) Tier II is small groups (Tier III is individual support)

Trustee Stanton had a question about Dr. Korri, the supervising psychiatrist. Superintendent Belfield - During the school year students at Grimshaw will be bused to the high school to receive services, while NYS reviews the plan for the space identified at Grimshaw.

> C. <u>LCSD Professional Learning</u> and <u>Response to Intervention</u> - Superintendent Belfield - These are the plans that help our professional staff deliver great goals and services to our students. We make sure we are aligned with the NYS professional learning standards. Teachers meet on Mondays for collaboration.

Trustee Moore asked about teachers possibly going to other schools during PLC meetings. Superintendent Belfield - Because the PLC process is so specific to a day and time, it would be a challenge for teachers to visit other schools during that specific schedule time. It could be done virtually but it would be best done in person.

President Reyburn asked the teachers and teaching assistants present if they find it hard to do the required professional development hours every five years.

Professional development also applies to Superintendent Belfield and Ms. Holtsbery.
