Things to consider


- Federal grants such as Title I, IIA and IV are not increasing at the same rate as salaries are increasing.
- The Foundation Aid formula is based on enrollment. For the past two years, our budgeted Foundation Aid, as predicted in January of that year, has been greater than the actual. The actual received was 1.4% less than predicted. This year, the Governor has guaranteed a 2% increase in Foundation Aid, so we could see a slight increase.
- There has been an increased need for special education programming.



Title I, IIA, IV, 611 and 619 Grants

- Each year we receive Title funds. Some are based on need, and others are based on performance on State tests.
- As funds remain the same and salaries increase, a smaller percentage of a person's salary can be included in the grants. This increases the amount of a teachers salary in the general fund.
