
Dear Families and Staff Members:

We are also planning to increase instrumental music at Grimshaw Elementary an additional day per week, which will allow for smaller band lesson groups and encourage more students to take advantage of opportunities in the performing arts. We are proud to offer these additional enhancements while still maintaining one of the lowest school property tax rates in Onondaga County. Did You Know?

An estimated 50,000 motor vehicles illegally pass New York State school buses everyday.

THE LAW SAYS: It is illegal - and very dangerous - to pass a stopped school bus when the large red lights located on top of the bus are flashing. Flashing lights mean the bus is picking up or discharging students.

You must stop whether you are approaching the school bus from the front or overtaking it from the rear.

You must always stop for flashing red lights, even on divided and multilane highways and on school grounds.

The first-time fine for illegally passing a school bus is a \$250 to \$400 fine, 5 points on your license, and/or possibly 30 days in jail.

Worse yet, the memory of hitting or killing a child may be one you carry for the rest of your life.



Joe Evans (Class of 1985), retired Syracuse Police Officer, pictured with his wife Diana, a retired NYS Court Officer along with his daughters Maria DeJesus, Marissa (Class of 2020), who attends SUNY Oneonta and Amanda (Class of 2022), who attends SUNY Brockport.

On October 23, 2022, Joe fell 15 feet off a roof in Canada, crushing several vertebrae and significantly damaging his spinal cord. He had emergency back surgery and had a plate attached to the back of his skull and installed two rods fusing 14 vertebrae from his skull to the middle of his back. He spent the next 8 weeks recovering in the hospital. Joe is home now but continues to be paralyzed from his chest down. We are hoping that

donations from these games will help pay for the modifications to Joe's home, rehabilitation, and adaptive equipment costs for Joe's continued recovery. Prior to his accident, Joe was active in outdoor sports such

as lacrosse, golf, hunting and fishing and we are confident that with today's technology, he can continue many of those activities.

Joe's goal is to be as independent as possible, and hopefully continue to yell and cheer on the LaFayette Lacrosse programs as he has his whole life.
